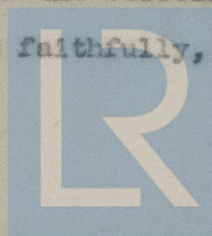

M. I duly received your letter of the 2nd instant, enclosing a copy of one from the Owners together with Request 1a in connection with the proposed classification with this Society of the above ships, and shall be glad if you will inform them that, owing to the shell plating being thinner than required by the Rules and to the scantlings being generally lighter, it is not possible to recommend these vessels to the Committee for the 100A- class.

If the Figure '1' is desired, the equipment should be in accordance with letter 'v', Table 53, of the Rules, provided the erections are similar to those contemplated for the original construction of the vessels.
