This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 4, 1943, relative to the above named vessel and regret that there has been some delay in forwarding the boiler report on same. This delay was due to the great pressure of work with the whole coast of California as a district and with temporary Surveyors only as assistants.

The errors in the first report are regretted, but these no doubt were due to some unfamiliarity with metric system. An amended report is herewith enclosed and would you please substitute same for the report forwarded at an earlier date?

SAFETY VALVES AND SUPERHEATER VALVES.

With regard to the adjusting of these valves, regret that the Surveyor was in error in stating that they were adjusted to 225 lbs. as the safety valves commenced to blow at 218 lbs. and blew fully at 225 lbs; the superheater valves commenced to lift a little ahead of the safety valves (i.e. 218 minus).

PUMPING ARRANGEMENTS.

Regarding this item, as there were no plans available at the time of the survey the Surveyor is unable to make a diagram from memory at this time, but the pumping arrangements appeared to be quite in order and recommend that they be further reported upon at the first practical date.

The Agents of the vessel have been notified that the following recommendations require to be attended to, i.e.:

Readjusting of safety valves of main boilers and superheaters, also plans or diagram of pumping arrangements require to be reported upon.

HULL

Regarding cement laid on bottom in dry tank under boilers, this was done, also the efficiency of the hatchways with supports and closing appliances, and the scantlings of the watertight bulkheads were examined and found satisfactory.

Regret that these items were inadvertently omitted from the report.
