the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of

Messrs. N. V. Stoomvaart Maatschappij "Nederland" of Batavia,
hold a survey on board of the Dutch Steamer:

"SINGKEP"
6607 tons gross of Batavia, No. 83454 in Lloyd's Register Book
1940/41, on the 22nd day of December 1941, in order to examine
the Sanitary Outlet Valve situate Starboard side in after end
of Lower Tween Decks Hatch No. 5, and report as follows:

I found the Casting had already been welded and was again
cracked. Hammer tests showed that the metal was very thin and
further crackage could be expected.

I ordered the Valve off and when examined it was too thin
to weld so a full coverage patch was welded on in accord with
my instructions.

A new spare Valve is recommended as present Valve cannot
be relied upon for more than a year.

The work being completed to my satisfaction I have reported
so to Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London.
