"REQUESTED THEIR MADRID OFFICE TO PAY IN STERLING
"OWING TO BANKING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN DELAYED.
"IF NOT PAID SHORTLY FEES WILL BE PAID IN PESETAS
"AT BILBAO".

With reference to this case, I have to point out that this vessel apparently left Bilbao on the 11th September for Genoa; left Genoa on the 25th September for Buenos Aires; left Buenos Aires on the 25th October for Genoa, so that she has been trading without a Classification Certificate.

It is obvious that this is not in the Owners' interests, and if any casualty had occurred it might have been exceedingly inconvenient for them.
