Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 18th instant together with a photostat copy of a letter which you received from Schiffswerft Memel Lindenau & Cie., Memel regarding the accounts rendered to them for the survey during construction of the s.s. "CARIPITENO", Yard No. 53.

In reply I have to state that Mr. Lindenau wrote me a letter on the 3rd instant with the climax that I should give him my advice for the purpose of obtaining a reduction in the fees and expenses due for the classification of the above vessel. In answer I told Mr. Lindenau that the only advice I could give him in the matter was to address any wishes he had in that respect directly to you for the reason that I did not wish to interfere with the payment of the accounts. With reference to Mr. Lindenau's remark that my account includes the travelling expenses for the second vessel No. 54 which is still in the Yard, ready for launching, I have to explain that in view of all visits on this ship coinciding with those on the first vessel and of the fact that the expenses were incurred as long as over 3 years ago I considered it quite correct to include all outstanding expenses in my account.

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Mr. Lindenau's letter to you may convey the impression that the second vessel is now being completed for delivery but, so far, I have had no information whatever, to that effect.

Perhaps it is of interest that, according, to the Builder's own statement he received £ 18 000:0:0 from the Chilean Owners as part payment towards the two ships which were originally contracted for the total sum of £ 45 000:0:0. He is now to receive an additional sum of £ 20 000:0:0 from the present Owners so that he has obtained a total amount of £ 38 000:0:0 with the second vessel still remaining at his disposal.

It would therefore appear that the Builder is quite capable of meeting the accounts under consideration.
