Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 6th instant with reference to the account, returned herewith, for fees due to this Society in connexion with the survey of the Motor Vessel "CRISTO" here in March last, and in reply I have to explain that on the 8th March a letter was received from Messrs. Flannery, Baggallay & Johnson Ltd. stating that Messrs. Van Oppen & Co. had advised them that the vessel had been sold, and that the purchasers desired the attendance of the Society's Surveyors on board the vessel, which was lying in Mills & Knight's Dock.

In consequence, the Society's Surveyors attended, and not only surveyed the vessel in drydock and the repairs effected, but made a complete examination of the engines, including the propeller shaft, and the enclosed account has reference to this matter.

I should add that the survey was necessary in order to the retention of the vessel's classification in the Society's Register Book, and I shall be pleased to receive a remittance for the amount due so that the classification may be in order.
