John G. Kincaid & Co. of Greenock, who have disposed of them to Messrs. J. Coughlan & Sons of Vancouver.

The Fairfield Company state that the Machinery was built to the order of the Ministry of Shipping, and that they (the Builders) are not responsible for the Society's fees, and Messrs. Kincaid & Co. also state that they are not responsible for the fees. I shall therefore be glad to know whether you will collect the same from the Ministry.


