Vic Craft in Armament Service -
Policy respecting future surveys.

With reference to your letters dated 2nd September, 1946 and 18th October 1946, and further to my letter A.S.7149/46/D.19 dated 28th October 1946, I am to inform you that in accordance with Admiralty practice, the "Vic" class vessels that have been allocated to the Armament Supply Department for permanent service, will no longer be maintained in class; action is being initiated to have the Registry of the vessels closed.

2. No further Surveys by your Surveyor will therefore be necessary in future on the following vessels in Armament Supply service:-

Vic No. 62 at R.N. Armament Depot, Bull Point, Plymouth.
