This vessel appears to have been built in accordance with the Rules and the approved plans, and it is submitted she is eligible to be classed *100A1 ("Steel") "For Towing purposes", as recommended.

The Surveyors have forwarded a letter which they have received from the Builders, in which they point out that the vessel was launched on the 27th June 1908, and that according to the Rules the date of build would be recorded in the Register Book as December 1908. In view, however, of the six months which are allowed by the Rules from the date of launch expiring so near the end of the year 1908, namely, December 27th, they ask that the date of build to be recorded in the Register Book may be January 1909.

The Builders' request is submitted for the favourable consideration of the Committee.
