Dear Sir,

Adverting to your letter of the 28th ultimo, respecting the steam trawler "LA MOUETTE", the Committee regret to note that you are still not satisfied with the survey held on this vessel during construction by the Society's Surveyors at Hull.

As you are aware New Holland, where the vessel was built, is some distance from Hull, at which port the Society's Surveyors are stationed, and it is no doubt on this account that Mr. A.B. Wilson, the Surveyor who had the case of this vessel in hand, unfortunately has not had the advantage of meeting with your goodself at any time. Had this been the case the Committee feel sure the misunderstanding which appears to have arisen would have been avoided.

I may say that the Surveyor in question has had a large experience in the survey of steam trawlers, and has been found to be a careful and competent officer.
