In December last Mr. Ostragradsky, the Commercial Attache to the Russian Embassy, stated that the "VLADIMIR RUSSANOFF" and "GEORGIY SEDOFF" were at Archangel, and that the "CANADA" had been redelivered to the Russian Government in December, 1920. These vessels, and the "KNIAZ POJARSKY" are in the hands of the Bolsheviki.

The representation of Russian Shipping interests in London has recently been changed, and the new representative states that the Russian Government Shipping is in progress of liquidation and that he can give no information whatever regarding these vessels, nor can he suggest any likely source of information.

In the circumstances, the Classing Committee, who had the cases of these vessels before them on Tuesday, 5th instant, decided to expunge the class in each case with a red

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line (7, 2'), indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
