Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 15th inst. respecting the ferro-concrete vessels "CRETACITE", "CRETECOAL", "CRETECOKE" and "CRETELL", and in reply I have to point out that the conditions under which these vessels retain their classes in the Register Book are those set forth in my letter of the 12th inst., viz:-

"that the annual surveys be carried out before the vessels are again sent to sea, and that you undertake to have this done if they remain your property, and should they be offered for sale, to inform intending purchasers that the classes are allowed to remain subject to this being done".

You will observe that your letter does not cover the above terms and I shall be glad to be favoured with a further line on the subject.
