Dear Sir,

S It is understood that the tanker "APPLELEAF", formerly a Royal Fleet Auxiliary, has been transferred and is now in the hands of the Ministry for disposal as she lies.

By a long standing arrangement with the Naval Stores Department of the Admiralty their fleet auxiliaries are retained in the Society's classification, and the enclosed copy of letter dated 28th April 1945, will serve to illustrate the position of the classification of this vessel at that time.

The record of "Examined 3,45." which was then assigned had a validity of twelve months which expired at the end of March last. Accordingly she has no valid classification and had she been a commercial vessel, the Committee would doubtless have expunged her present classification records from the Register Book.

Seeing that she is up for sale, they feel sure you will appreciate that she should not be regarded as a classed ship, and unless you have any strong objection they propose to delete her class forthwith.
