Dear Mr. Mancor,

Reverting to your letter of the 6th December relative to the case of the steamer "INTERNATIONAL", built by the Great Lakes Engineering Works with a view to classification, you will remember that Mr. Crosthwaite, the President of the Atlantic Coast Steamship Company, had written to Mr. Pessano, the Builders' representative, on the subject of the spare gear, and that it was understood Mr. Pessano had already addressed a letter to this office regarding the matter. We have been awaiting this letter, but none has yet been received here, and in the meantime the consideration of the case remains in abeyance.

We have now had a cabled message of enquiry from Mr. Evan Edwards, the Surveyor at Cleveland, as to when he may expect to receive the certificate of classification for the vessel, and I thought it best to cable to you as follows, and now await your further good news:-

"INTERNATIONAL NO LETTER FROM PESSANO CLEVELAND


"SURVEYOR ASKING FOR CERTIFICATE PLEASE EXPEDITE MATTER".
