Dear Sirs,

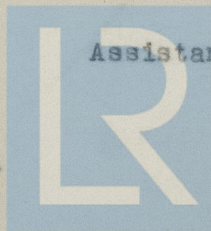
I duly received your letters of the 5th and 6th instant relative to the classification and freeboard certificates of your steamer "PARKLANDS", and with regard to your remarks in this matter, I think it well to explain that, as printed on the freeboard certificate, the freeboard assigned is valid only so long as the vessel retains her class. The survey of the bunkers and the testing of the tank in way thereof are essential details in connexion with the classification, and although the Committee, in order to meet your wishes, have agreed to assign the class to the steamer subject to these requirements being complied with, they rely upon your kindly making arrangements to have them attended to on the steamer's return from her next voyage, as indicated in the certificate of classification.
