Bottom and rudder cleaned, examined, found in good condition and recoated.

Examined generally decks, casings, hatchways and their closing appliances, ventilators, skylights, steering gear, windlass and general equipment and found in good condition. Previous temporary repair in fore peak tank in way of indented stem examined and found to remain efficient. Fore peak tank not leaking when full of water. A number of local indents in shell (p & s) were noted.

A fractured ballast injection valve chest (starboard side) now renewed together with a new length of pipe from this valve to the distribution chest.

Examined propeller aft. end of sternbush and fastenings of all underwater connections and found in good condition.
