Ministry of Shipping survey the machinery of the ex-German
"GOLDFELD", 7458 tons gross, while lying afloat in
Dry Docks on the 26th and 30th March 1920, for the purpose
ascertaining as far as practicable the condition of the
machinery.

This survey has been held in conjunction with the
ship owners' representative.

A general examination has now been made as follows:-

Cylinders and pistons, valves and valve faces opened out
examined, also the crank, thrust and tunnel shafting, air
and circulating pump.

This vessel is proceeding to Swansea where it is stated
remaining part of the conditional survey will be completed.

Judging from the inspection of the parts of the machinery
opened up and examined, I am of the opinion the vessel is
a fit condition to run for a period of six months, subject
the survey being completed, as stated above.
