H. With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the steamer "CITY OF VERNON" and to my letter of the 20th June last regarding the survey of the Water Tube Boilers, I have to acquaint you that this vessel was recently surveyed by the Society's London Surveyors who reported that the following boiler tubes were renewed:- 21 in starboard boiler, 36 in centre boiler and 2 in port boiler. The Surveyors were informed that the Boiler Survey would be held on the steamer's arrival in America.

It was subsequently reported in the Shipping Papers that the vessel had put back to Gravesend with defective tubes in port boiler, but she would appear to have passed Dover on the 18th instant bound for Galveston. In the circumstances I shall be glad to learn in due course how the case stands.
