Dear Sir,

With reference to the case of the steamer "ADOLPHE URBAN", I beg to acquaint you that in order to entitle the vessel to have her class reinstated in the Society's Register Book, the whole of the requirements of the Society's Rules, as regards the hull, will require to be complied with, excepting the examination of the vessel in dry dock. With respect to the machinery, the auxiliary pumps and the steering engine will require to be examined, the safety valves adjusted under steam, the L.P. valve spindle feed and bilge pump rams, L.P. piston junk ring and the two bottom doors of the main boiler renewed, the circulating pump rod, L.P. valve and port facing trued up and the screw shaft drawn in and examined.
