Thanks for your letter of the 6th October.

The original freeboards (18.10.40) from steel shelter deck were:-

Summer	11'-11 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
Tropical fresh		10'-9 $\frac{5}{8}$ "
Fresh Water		11'-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
Tropical		11'-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
Winter		12'-6 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

This corresponds with the draught for a C.S.S. ship having a virtual moulded depth of 30.58 feet to the second deck (i.e. 8 feet below shelter deck). The actual moulded depth to the second deck was 29'-10".

The vessel never had wartime deeper loading either under Memorandum M.3387/41 or Memorandum M.151969/41, being sunk in either 1940 or early 1941.
