Dear Sir,

I have to confirm my cablegram to you yesterday as follows, viz:-

GOLDENFELS	= Vessel's name
VAKEV	= forward to this Office
YCTUZ	= what fees should be charged in this case
VEWZA	= in your opinion
YCZEB	= do not apply for a fee in this case
VLACO	= until
VEPJU	= approved.

It is observed that in the case of the Steamer "CROSTAFELS" which has been under your survey with a view to re-classification in the Society's Register Book, you have charged fees amounting to a total of £56, viz:- £30 for the Hull and £26 for the Machinery, and I have to explain that had the survey of this vessel taken place in the United Kingdom the amount charged for the survey and re-classification would have been not less than £75, excluding travelling expenses.

In all cases of the kind, it is the practice for the local Surveyors to forward to this Office a statement showing the number of visits paid and the extent of the work done, after which they are advised of the amount which it is considered should be charged, and it will be convenient if you will follow this practice in future cases, and render
