The class is subject to stem and stem plating being faired at the first convenient opportunity.


The 2nd Special Survey No.3 became due 9,37 and the vessel being laid up, the Owners furnished the usual undertaking.

Action was subsequently deferred as the vessel continued to be laid up.

The Liverpool Office now forwards letters from the Fleetwood Surveyor and the Owners to the effect that it is Owners intention to withdraw the trawler from class.

The year of grace expired 9,38.

It is submitted for consideration whether the vessel's class should not now be expunged with a Red Line(10.39), indicating non-compliance with the Rules.
