Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your Wood Barquentine "FOREST FRIEND", I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have had under consideration a telegram received from the Society's Surveyor at Seattle, on which it appears that the vessel has left that port without being submitted for Special Survey, which became due on this vessel under the Society's Rules so long ago as November 1927.

I may say that when the vessel left Australia for Puget Sound, her class in the Society's Register Book was allowed to remain undisturbed only on the definite understanding that the overdue Special Survey would be carried out without fail upon her arrival at Puget Sound, and as this arrangement has not been carried into effect, the Committee have had no option but to give instructions for her class to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
