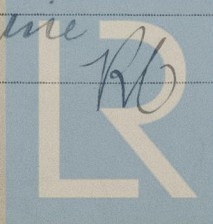

In the circumstances the Committee gave instructions that the Adelaide Surveyor should be requested by cablegram to inform the Owners that the Special Survey must take place on the vessel's arrival at Puget Sound or she would lose her class.

2. "FOREST FRIEND".

On the 4th ultimo the Seattle Surveyor wrote:-

"On the 10th of December 1928 upon a signed request of Captain E. L. Tindall, Master of the bark, who brought the vessel in from Australia, I made a preliminary survey while she lay afloat at Winslow, Eagle Harbor, Washington and found that besides other repairs necessary it was my duty to recommend the renewal of the main mizzen and jigger masts, the caulking of the main and quarter decks throughout and renewal of wire stays to bowsprit, also certain repairs to foreyard.

Nothing was done in the matter and some weeks subsequent I heard that the vessel was being offered for sale and having written several letters to Captain Tindall, resident at the Frye Hotel in the City, I also on the 15th of January sent forward the usual undertaking for signature in regard to the possible sale of the vessel.

Up to the present time I have had no reply to my communications and I have been unable to see Captain Tindall."

In reply to a further cablegram the Surveyor now telegraphs:-

"FOREST FRIEND NOW TOWED UNDER COVER OF NIGHT TO
"VICTORIA BRITISH COLUMBIA WITH HALF TIME SURVEY INCOMPLETE
"NO REPAIRS EFFECTED ALL BILLS AGAINST VESSEL OUTSTANDING
"STOP HAVE INFORMED VANCOUVER SURVEYOR FULLY OF ALL
"CIRCUMSTANCES."
