Dear Sir:-

Herewith I acknowledge your letter of the 26th. March, in reply to your enquiry as to how the equipment of the Motor Car Ferry "MOTOR PRINCESS", (Vancouver Report No. 1047) now stands, I may state that Capt. Troupe Manager of the C. P. R. British Columbia Coast Services has informed me that the vessel during the summer will be operated on ferry service between Sidney B. C., and Bellingham Wash., and that in his opinion the addition of a stream anchor and wire to the present equipment will on this run not be of service to the vessel. Capt Troupe further states that should this vessel be later placed on coastwise service a stream anchor and wire will then be installed.

In view of the above I beg to recommend that during such time as the vessel remains in service between Sidney and Bellingham, that the equipment be approved as at present, subject to stream anchor and cable or wire installed if vessel is placed on service between Puget Sound and Skagway.
