This vessel was recently owned by Messrs. Stelp & Leighton Ltd., and has been laid up in the River Tyne for a considerable time past, the usual undertaking having been furnished by them.

It appeared from a report recently received from the Registrar General that the vessel had been sold to Spaniards, and in answer to enquiry Messrs. Stelp & Leighton stated that she is now the property of Mr. A. T. Vega, of Gijon, who does not wish to retain the vessel's class, as he intends to sink her and use her as a breakwater.

In view of the fact that the overdue surveys had not been carried out, and it was understood that the vessel was due to leave Newcastle on the 14th instant, the Classing Committee, who had the case before them on the 17th instant decided to give instructions for the vessel's character to be expunged with a red line (Q26), indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
