I enclose herewith a letter from the Osaka Shosen Kaisha, in which they request Freeboard Certificate for the Steel Sc. Sr. "Atlas Maru".

As the ship was built here, Mr. Cox sent the letter to me, and asked me to apply direct for the Certificates to be issued in duplicate with an endorsement stating that "These Freeboards are the same as those previously assigned by this Society on....

With regards to the Owners' remark that the original Certificates had not been supplied I have to advise you that the original Certificates were received at this office and handed over to the Builders, who acknowledged the receipt of same, and now say that these Certificates were, in turn, transferred by them to the Osaka Shosen Kaisha, Head Office. The Certificates must, therefore, have been lost after they came into the Owners' possession.
