~~WA~~ surveyed the French s.s. "GRANDLIEU" on the 21st & 22nd day of March

last, in consequence of her having in the course of manoeuvring in the port on the evening of the 20th March 1940, touched the bottom between the "Ravin Blanc" North Buoy and the Quay, following the declaration of the Master.

On examination of this vessel on the days named I
~~WA~~ found the vessel loaded with a coal cargo. I sounded where possible and ~~WA~~ had the punpe working in the other compartments (Holds 1 & 4), from the morning of the 21st March 1940. No water found. The same operation was carried out on the morning of the 22nd March 1940. No water found. I also requested that a diver make an examination of the vessel's bottom.

I
~~WA~~ also saw the diver going down to examine the vessel's bottom, and he reports an follows:- I ascertained that on the Starboard side in way of No 2 hold, from the commencement of hold No 3, there existed a scrap of about 15 c/m on a lenght of about 20 metres underneath reports: - That he examined her bottom, and that he found the Bilge Keel. The rivets do not appear to have been damaged.

~~We~~ have been able to make, as far as possible, I
~~We~~ conscientiously believe the said vessel can proceed on her voyage.
