Dear Sirs,

I beg to inform you that the new Owners of the steamer "GUN 7", Messrs. A/S. Sevilla (Managers, Messrs. Chr. Salvesen & Co., Leith) have requested to be furnished with an interim certificate to enable the vessel to proceed from your port, where she now is, to Norway, where it is stated the overdue Second Special Survey No.1 will be held.

This vessel, as you are no doubt aware, is classed with this Society, and the year of grace allowed for the completion of the survey in question expired at the end of August last.

It was understood that the late Owners had arranged to carry out this survey at Walvis Bay about the middle of October, and this arrangement had been agreed to by the Committee, Lloyd's Agents at that port having been requested to appoint a competent and independent Surveyor for the purpose of holding the survey.

In view of the request now received from the new Owners, I have to inform you that the Committee, who have had the case under consideration, will be prepared

to agree to the vessel proceeding to a port in Norway for the survey, provided she is found in a fit condition for the voyage.

In these circumstances the Committee will authorise you to appoint a competent and independent Surveyor to carry out a general examination of the hull, machinery and boiler, and if this survey is quite satisfactory I shall be glad if you will arrange to issue an interim certificate for the voyage in question.

I may add that all fees and expenses incurred in connexion with the carrying out of the survey must be paid by the Owners, or their Representatives, and should accordingly be charged by you to them.

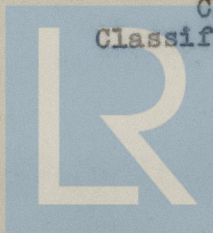
The cable in Lloyd's code sent you to-day requesting you to appoint a Surveyor is confirmed by the copy enclosed herewith.
