Twentyfour (24) new wood hatch covers fitted. Three (3) new hatch seats fitted. Fastening arrangements on Engine Room and fiddley doors all in good working order.

The fittings and appliances for the protection of openings, guard rails, freeing ports, and means of access to Crew's Quarters examined and found in good order.

No material alterations have been made which affect the calculation of freeboard.


The nature of the closing appliances has been checked with the certificate, and these found in order.
