CERTIFICATE OF BOILER.

This is to Certify that the *two* main Boilers made by *the Mitsubishi Dockyard & Engine Works* for the *Steamer No. 252*, building by them, and marked as below, have been surveyed during construction by the undersigned. The material has been tested by the Surveyors to Lloyd's Register; the scantlings are in accordance with the Society's Rules for a working pressure of *200* lbs. per square inch, and the workmanship is good. The Boilers having been tested in my presence on the *17th February, 1916* by hydraulic pressure to *400* lbs. per square inch, showed no signs of weakness, and were found tight and sound in every respect at that pressure. Working pressure not to exceed *two hundred* lbs. per square inch.
