This is to Certify that

at the request of Messrs. Mitsubishi Denki Kaisha, Ltd., Nagasaki, attend at their works, on the 15th & 17th April 1933, in order to examine under test, Two Compound Wound, direct current, 55 H.P. Motors, No. 14105 & 14106, of 220 volts, by 279 amps and 1000 revolutions per minute, for Sea Water Pump.

These Motors ordered by Messrs. Kobe Seiko-sho, Kobe, are intended for Vessel No. 189, now being built by Messrs. Harima Zosen-sho.

The Motors were submitted to the following tests:-

Full load test of 4½ hours duration.
25% overload test of 2 hours duration.
50% overload test for 2 minutes.

The rise of temperature was measured by thermometers and on completion of trials high voltage (2000 volts, A.C.) and insulation tests were carried out, and all found satisfactory.
