Dear Sirs,

We have duly received your letter of the 8th instant to which we have not replied sooner owing to our absence from Paris.

As we already told you, when the "LA HAGUE" and "LA NEVE" were building under the Survey of Lloyd's Register in England, we received from the Marine Marchande Department, Owners of the ships, instructions to transfer the vessels to the Bureau Veritas when completed. These instructions have been complied with and the two vessels are now classed with the Bureau Veritas.

You ask us whether the Lloyd's class should be suppressed in the Register Book or maintained until the next periodical inspection has become due. We are somewhat embarrassed to give you a reply in the matter, as we do not see what consequences may result, for one of these vessels or for both, from the maintenance or the suppression of the class in the Register Book.

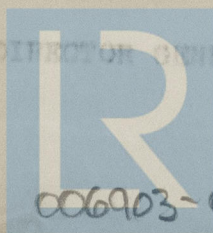
We have always had an excellent intercourse with Lloyd's Register and we would like to meet you wishes. If your Head Office prefers to maintain these vessels class in the Register Book for a certain space to time, on the condition that this would be imply any obligation for us, we presume (but we have no certificate on this point) that no inconvenience would result from this course, but we cannot modify the fact that the "LA HAGUE" and "LA NEVE" are now classed with the Bureau Veritas and with the Bureau Veritas only and that we cannot engage ourselves to pay any fee or indemnity whatever to another Classification Society.

The above answer applies also to the notation of RMC relative to the Refrigerating installation, you will therefore maintain or suppress this notation according to your personal appreciation.

In this connection we should like to remark that if they installations have been devised for Mediterranean Service, they are sufficient for tropical Waters; our practice of the banana trading between West Indies and France is sufficient to permit us of making this statement.
