

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed with fresh record of survey 4-41, subject to No.4 plate from aft in 2nd strake and Nos.3 and 4 plates in 3rd strake below sheer (starboard side) being repaired at first convenient opportunity and a bower anchor being supplied, being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.
