Dear Sirs,

Steam Trawler "YORICK".

I am in receipt of your letter of the 27th instant regarding the above named trawler, and in reply would confirm that for reinstatement of class it will be necessary for the requirements of a 3rd Special Survey No.3 which includes the drilling of the plating to be carried out, and full particulars of the equipment on board to be furnished. In this connection it is thought well to refer to your report No.44659 in which the particulars of the original and last drillings are indicated.

Should it not be practicable to complete the requisite survey for re-classification, it is considered that at least a General Examination should be made of the vessel in dry dock, in accordance with Circular No.1772, and that Boiler and Screwshaft Surveys should be held, unless the documentary evidence is forthcoming to the effect that the last named inspection has been recently carried out. On receipt of a satisfactory report of such an examination the vessel will be
