Old Rules.

The vessel received damage in launching, repairs have been effected at Barry. Bottom cleaned & coated, 4 shell plates removed & faired & 4 faired in place, 8 frames, 1 reverse frame & 6 floors faired in place & minor repairs.

This vessel appears to have been built in accordance with the Rules and the approved plans, and it is submitted she is eligible to be classed **✱ 100A1 (Stul) "Shelter deck"** with freeboard," as recommended. The Summer freeboard of $10' 7\frac{3}{4}"$ from centre of disc to top of statutory deck line at **shelter** deck, now marked on the vessel's sides, to be inserted in the classification certificate, and recorded in the Register Book, and further, the remaining freeboards, as shown on the accompanying verification form to be inserted in the certificate of classification.
