The Netherlands Shipping & Trading Committee, Ltd. (Short sea, coastal and Trawl fishing Sections) survey the motor vessel "MARY" 170 tons gross of Terapel, formerly classed with Germanischer Lloyd, on the 28th May, 1946 and subsequently whilst she lay on Philip & Sons Floating dock.

The following parts of Hull and Machinery were examined viz;

HULL Bottom; rudder; holds; forecastle; poop and machinery spaces; decks; casings, ventilators and coamings; air pipes; hatchways and closing appliances; masts, rigging and general equipment and found in satisfactory condition.

The steering gear and its connections and windlass are in good working order.

MACHINERY Propeller, and after end of stern tube bush and sea connections and fastenings examined and found in order. Main and auxiliaries examined as far as practicable, without opening out.

Main engines and auxiliaries examined under working conditions and found in order. Chief Engineer stated that machinery was giving every satisfaction.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT Generators, cables, switchboard fittings, distribution boxes examined. Insulation tests made on all circuits.

and that we will transmit to the committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a report stating that all repairs recommended by us have been completed to our satisfaction, and that we will recommend the vessel have fresh record of survey 6,46 and notation of "Examined L.R. 6,46" indicating that from the parts now seen the vessel appears to be in an efficient condition for a period of 12 months from 6,46.

This Certificate is issued upon the terms of the Rules and Regulations of the Society, which provide that:—


