Surveyed the S.V. " OKSYWIE ", 768 tons gross, of Szczecin, on the 28th February 1950 and subsequently, as the vessel lay afloat at Polish Quay, Gdynia, on account of damage stated to have been sustained on the 17th. February 1950, due to grounding, by the Porder Light, at the entrance to the Porder, prior to picking up pilot, and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be retained as Classed, without fresh Record of Survey, subject to the temporary repairs to the aft end No. 5 BB. tank being specially examined and dealt with as necessary at the next dry-docking, and to 15 fms. of chain cable being supplied being fit to carry her usual cargoes.
