S.S. "CHIU CHIN" ex "TA CHING"
S.S. "YUAN PEI" ex "TA SHUN"

I have to confirm the telegram sent to you today
as follows:

"CHIU CHIN EX TACHING YUAN PEI EX TASHUN OWNERS STATE
FREEBOARD AS ASSIGNED INSUFFICIENT AND NOW OVERLOADING
VESSELS"

I have had several discussions with the Owners
of these two vessels, Messrs. China Merchants S.N. Co.
which is a Chinese Government concern, regarding the freeboard
as assigned to these vessels by the Committee and they have
stated verbally that the freeboard was not sufficient for them
to operate on. I suggested that they look into the possibility
of strengthening the vessels so that a less freeboard could
be assigned, or if they did not wish to do this, to notify
this Office regarding their intentions.

This has not been done and I have now seen the
S.S. "CHIU CHIN" on the loading berth very much deeper
laden than the freeboard assigned.
