the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners' Representative survey the Dutch Steel Screw Trawler "NEPTUNUS", 171 tons gross whilst lying afloat in St. Andrew's Dock, Hull on the 13th July, 1945 and subsequently on account of damage alleged to have been sustained by vessel grounding in Aberdeen Harbour on the 23rd June, 1945.

Vessel generally examined for leakage as far as practicable whilst lying afloat (bunkers full of coal) and no leakage noted or damage observed.

It is recommended a further examination be held in dry dock or on slipway at the first convenient opportunity.
