Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of the 17th instant enclosing one from the Queen Fishing Co.Ltd., indicating their decision to withdraw their trawlers from the Society's classification.

In connection therewith, it appears from our records that the majority of their classed vessels are now on Admiralty Service and I should be glad if you would point out to them that in such cases, it has been agreed to leave the particulars of class in the Register Book undisturbed, pending their re-delivery;. In those cases, therefore, there would appear to be no point in withdrawing the classes at the present time, seeing that no surveys are required by the Society's Surveyors whilst they are under Admiralty requisition. It is considered, therefore, that in the light of the above remarks, they might wish to amend their request so as to confine it to those trawlers of their fleet which may be still engaged in ordinary fishing services.

In your reply I should be glad if you would kindly detail the names of the vessels concerned under their respective categories.
