Dear Sirs,

Reverting to my letter of the 16th and your reply of the 17th instant relative to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your Ferro-Concrete vessels "CRETINHAMBER", "CRETIFARM", "CRETIVORGE" and "CRETSHILL", I beg to acquaint you that the following vessels of your fleet have also come up for consideration, viz:- the

"CRETIBLOCK"
"CRETIBOOM"
"CRETIGAFF"
"CRETIMAST"
and "CRETIJETTY".

As you are aware, all these vessels are more than two years overdue for Special Survey, and as it would appear they are still laid up, with no immediate prospect of being again placed in commission, the Committee do not see how they can agree to their classes being retained in the Register Book indefinitely.

They will, however, be willing to allow the vessels' classes to remain undisturbed until the next Periodical Survey, the Special Survey No. 2, becomes due in each case, provided a general examination be now made by the Society's Surveyors and the vessels be found in good condition.

I may add that when the next Periodical Survey becomes due in each case, it will be necessary for the Special Survey to be held at that time, if it is your desire to retain the vessels in classification.

As, however, it would appear from your letter of the 17th instant that it is not your intention to submit the four vessels mentioned therein for survey as required, I shall be glad to learn whether this decision also applies to the five vessels now under consideration, viz:- the "CRISTENBLOCK", "CRISTENBOGE", "CRISTENGAFF", "CRISTENHAST" and "CRISTENJATTF", in order that all these vessels may be considered by the Committee at one time.
