H. With reference to your letter of the 26th and my reply of the 31st March last respecting the ferro-concrete tug "CRETEBLOCK", I beg to acquaint you that this case received the consideration of the Committee at their Meeting to-day, and that in view of the vessel being laid up, the Committee are agreeable to the Special Survey No.1 being postponed for the present in the event of it not being convenient to you to complete the same at an early date, on the conditions they usually require in the cases of vessels which are overdue for survey and are lying up indefinitely, viz:- that the survey be carried out before the vessel is again sent to sea, and that you undertake to have this done if she remain your property, and, should she be offered for sale, to inform intending purchasers that the class is allowed to remain subject to this being done.

I shall therefore be glad to learn that you are willing to agree to these conditions and that you will immediately advise this Office of the name and address of the purchasers in the event of a sale being effected.
