A. With reference to your first entry report No.10490 on the Wood Screw Drifter "LOP" built by Messrs. G. Courtney & Co., I have to inform you that an account has to-day been rendered to the Admiralty for the fee due for the survey during construction of the Hull of this vessel, viz:-£16, and on payment your account will be credited accordingly.
