Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 6th instant enclosing a copy of a communication you have received from the Fishery Board for Scotland respecting the classification certificates of the steam drifters "MELODY" and "MORN", and with regard thereto I think it well to inform you that the fees for the survey of the machinery of these vessels, which was constructed by Messrs. A. Dodman & Co. Ltd., have not yet been paid, and in accordance with the usual practice these certificates cannot be issued until the fees are received.

In the circumstances I am writing to Messrs. Dodman & Co., by to-night's post, informing them of the application which has been received from the Fishery Board for Scotland, and perhaps it will be well for you also to take the matter up with them with a view to an early settlement being made.

On payment of the machinery fees the certificates would, in the usual course, be forwarded to the Engineers, and if the certificates are required to be forwarded direct to Aberdeen and Leith respectively it will be necessary for Messrs. Dodman & Co's consent to this procedure to be obtained.
