Messrs. C.H. Walker and Co. Ltd. Sudbrook, survey during construction the steel boiler No. 5219 built by Messrs. Riley Bros.(Boilermakers) Limited Stockton, and intended for Messrs. Walker's S.S. No. 241. The material has been tested and the scantlings are in accordance with the Society's Rules for a working pressure of 180 lbs. The boiler was tested by hydraulic pressure to 260 lbs. in the presence of the undersigned on the 16th. April 1920, also examined under full steam pressure of 180 lbs. on the 15th. June 1920 and subsequently, when it shewed no signs of weakness and was found tight and sound in every respect at these pressures.


The working pressure should not exceed One hundred and eighty pounds (180 lbs.) per square inch.

For the purpose of identification the boiler has been stamped.
