 No. 3 lower hold (p.s.) being specially examined and dealt with as found
 necessary at next drydocking and to all other conditions, attached to the
 vessel's Class as previously recommended
 and being fit to carry usual cargoes.

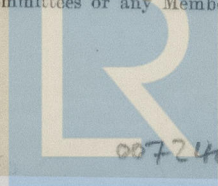
