Mr. Druery of the Ministry states that these vessels are now Ministry Owned and are laid up pending a decision as to whether they are to be re-converted for fishing or to be scrapped.

The vessels, which have been engaged on Boom Defence Work, were acquired by the Ministry as it was considered that the work for re-conversion for fishing would be so extensive as to be uneconomic. This question, however, is subject to further review and Mr. Druery will be pleased to advise the position in say three months' time.

It may be added that the Trawler "E & P" is stated by Mr. Druery to be now named "LAVEROCK".
