Dear Sir,

In accordance with their usual practice Messrs. Nippon Yusen Kaisha sent me a copy of their letter to you of the 10th March, requesting the withdrawal of the above vessel's classification.

When in Tokio a few days later I called upon Mr. Ohtani, Managing Director of the Company, to ascertain their reasons for the change and he informed me that she has now been fitted with insulated chambers, and will in future be engaged in the frozen meat trade between China and Japan, and for this trade they did not consider classification necessary.

I suggested to him the desirability of the Society's R.M.C. Certificate and pointed out the fact that the vessel had passed her 2nd. Special Survey No. 3 so recently as March of last year, and would not become due for another Special Survey until 1929.
