CERTIFICATE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF CARGO OIL IN BULK.

This is to Certify that

A. McClashan,

the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. Nippon Yusen Kaisha survey the "B" Deep Tank of the Steel Screw Motorship "WARUTO MARU", 7142 tons gross, of Tokio, whilst the vessel lay afloat at this port.

The "B" Deep Tank was tested on the 29th and 30th November, 1934 by a head of water to the top of the sounding pipes on weather deck, and upon examination, the boundary bulkheads, tank top, hatches, ventilators and other connections were found sound and tight.

The Double Bottom Tank in way of this Deep Tank was tested on the 4th December, 1934 by a head of oil fuel to the top of the sounding pipes on the weather deck and found sound and tight.

The heating coils in the "B" Deep Tank were tested to 100 lbs per. sq. inch pressure and found tight, on the 4th December, 1934.

This Deep Tank is considered fit to receive a shipment of cargo oil in bulk for the contemplated voyage subject to examination for cleanliness before loading.
